AGE 5

- ♣ Children's main focus is themselves
- ♣ They think of how things affect them rather than thinking of others
- ♣ They are becoming aware of life in and around South Woodham Ferrers depending on their life experiences

AGE 7

- Children become aware of more than just themselves
- ♣ Their awareness depends on their own life experiences
- They become more questioning
- They are starting to look for reasons for things
- ♣ They are beginning to think of 'big issues' such as death

AGE 9

- Children have views about things other than just themselves
- They are open to different ideas
- ♣ They can express their own views (often take on their parents' views)
- ♣ They show empathy with others
- They are aware of items on the news and want to discuss these (use of BBC Newsround)

AGE 11 - as for Age 9 plus:

- ♣ Children have a sense of themselves within a bigger picture
- They are aware of right and wrong and can express/discuss their views and those of others
- ♣ They are more aware of the impact and consequences of their actions/views on others
